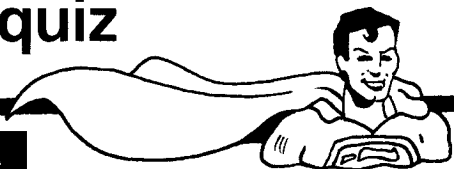


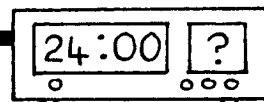

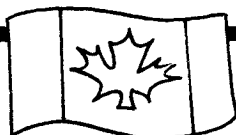

Preparation

Photocopy the worksheet and cut apart the A / B cards. Make enough copies for each pair of students to have an A card and a B card.

Procedure

- 1 Prepare students for the activity by asking different students sample questions, e.g. *How many colors are there in the American flag?* (3 – red, white and blue)
Check students' answers with the whole group.
- 2 Divide the class into two teams, A and B.
- 3 Give a copy of the team A card to each student on team A and a copy of the team B card to each student on team B.
- 4 Explain the activity. They are going to test each other's knowledge by asking the questions listed on their cards. Ask members of each team to choose a representative who will be responsible for giving the agreed answer to the other team.
- 5 Allow students a minute to familiarize themselves with the information on their cards. Answer any questions they might have.
- 6 Ask one student to keep the score. He / she should give one point for every correct answer.
- 7 Team A starts by choosing one student to ask team B the first question on their list. When team B has answered, they can choose a student to ask team A the first question on their list. Continue until all questions have been asked.
- 8 The team with the highest score wins.

Option

Cut out the answers and set them aside. Give the questions to pairs of students. Set a time limit of 10 minutes and have them answer the questions. When the time is up, check the answers. Give one point for every correct answer. The pair / group with the highest score wins the competition.

Additional ideas

Ask students to work in groups and prepare their own trivia quizzes, writing down the questions and answers on separate pieces of paper. Collect their papers and give them out to different groups. Ask each group to answer the questions. Give the answers back to the original group to check.
