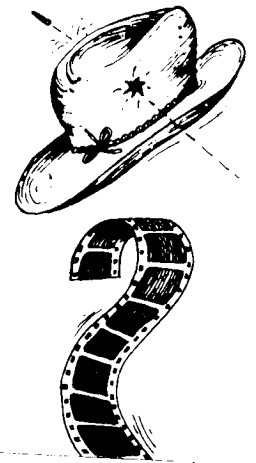


Who are the others ?

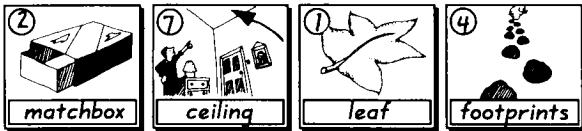
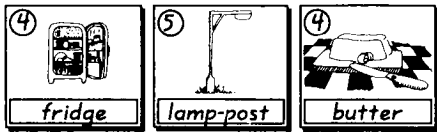

Elephant Jokes

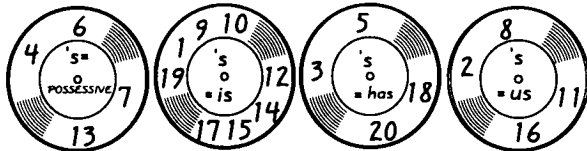
Page 49

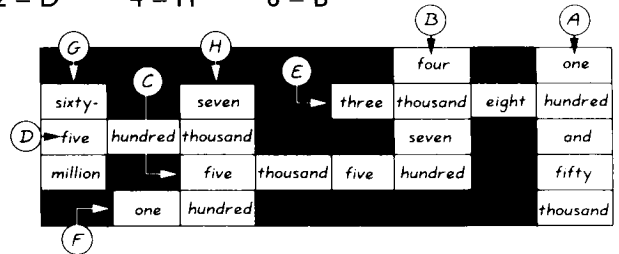
