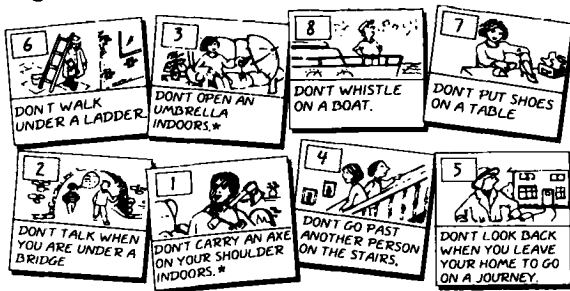

17th December 1903	← A →	17	12	03
24th August 1939	← B →	24	08	39
12th April 1961	← C →	12	04	61
2nd March 1969	← D →	02	03	69
20th July 1969	← E →	20	07	69
21st July 1969	← F →	21	07	69

$$\boxed{12} + \boxed{02} = \boxed{07} + \boxed{07} \quad (14)$$

$$\boxed{17} + \boxed{24} = \boxed{20} + \boxed{21} \quad (41)$$

Note: The dates in numbers (e.g. 17.12.03) are in the British style: day, month, year. In the United States, a different order is used: month, day, year (e.g. 12.17.03).
