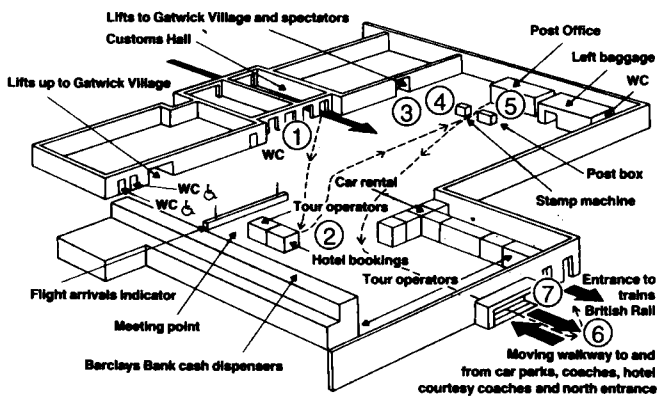
- Travel to and from the Airport: A23 trunk road, fully signposted

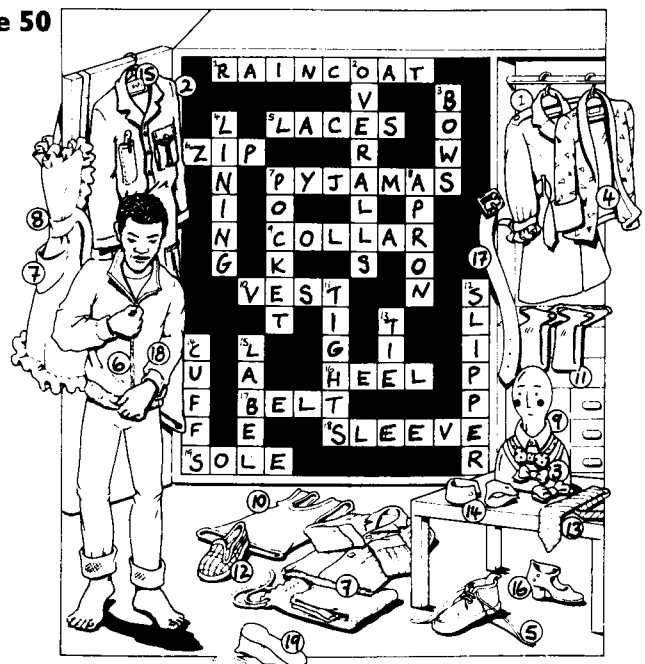
