End of Junk Food for School Kids?

Think about it: how often do you stop at a **store** on your way to school to buy some **candy**, **cookies**, or a **soda**? Every day? Once a week? Well, in Mexico, this may stop in the future. This is because some government officials want to stop anyone under 18 from buying unhealthy food and drinks such as **potato chips** and soft drinks. They say it's bad for their health. We asked two teens in Mexico what they think of this new idea.

Magda from Guadalajara says, "I don't think it's good for the store owners. They make money from people under 18. And kids who can't buy candy and soft drinks from a store can buy it from people who sell things in the street anyway. They need to teach kids in schools about diet and food so kids can make healthy choices."

Javier from Oaxaca disagrees. He says, "A lot of children in my neighborhood eat unhealthy food on the way to school. We should only buy unhealthy things when our parents agree. Or we can choose healthy food such as fruit and fresh juice."
