Tell us what you're good at, and we'll find a job for you!</i></p> <p>You were thinking about getting a summer job, so you decided to apply. Think about some jobs you can do at the camp. A group of your friends want to start a new afterschool club. The students will be in charge. Only indoor activities are possible, and your friends are looking for people to help with activities like arts and crafts, homework help, or indoor games and sports.</p> <p>Think about free-time activities you like and/or you are good at that could be good ideas for an after-school club.</p>
