- 1 I know this country needs a change, so I was disappointed to see that the general election will be held on 4 July 2024—just two months before my 18th birthday.
- 2 Like many other young people across the country, I feel helpless watching this government. It's sad that we cannot vote and change the decisions that the government makes. Instead, we have to watch older people vote and decide things that will impact us the most.
- 3 Take, for example, global heating. According to the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change, a person who was a child in 2020 may experience up to four times more extreme events during their lifetime under a 1.5-degree Celsius increase in global temperature. A person older than 55 will not experience any of those changes in their lifetime. But 16- and 17-year-olds can't vote and have to watch as the UK gives 100 oil and gas production licences for the North Sea, and as Rishi Sunak flies in a jet from Leeds to London, a journey that would only take two hours by train.
- 4 While 16—to 17-year-olds can't vote, they are old enough to work, pay taxes, and join the army; 17-year-olds can drive a car and donate blood. If 16- and 17-year-olds are old enough to help society in these ways, why can't we vote?
- 5 16-year-olds can already vote in Scotland for local and Scottish parliamentary elections. One report found that those who could vote from 16 were more likely to continue voting as they entered their 20s. Similar results were seen in Austria, where the voting age is 16 for nationwide elections.
- 6 Many young people see politics as boring and corrupt, and don't want to vote. Lowering the voting age to 16 would encourage them to take part. Young people need to express their opinions to ensure everyone has the same opportunities and a safe living environment in the future.

- 7 In their 14 years in power, the Conservative Party has failed young people. More than 270,000 children are waiting for mental health treatment, and university fees have risen from 3,000 pounds to 9,250 pounds per year.
- 8 The Conservatives blame our generation, promising to bring back national military service to "get young people out of their bubble" when all we need is for them to treat us with respect and allow us a voice.
