Article summary: In this article, the writer shares his concerns about his screen time.

Time: 60 minutes

Skills: Reading, Speaking

Language focus: Linking words and phrases

Materials needed: One copy of the worksheet per student

1. Warmer

a. Ask students to work in pairs and discuss the questions. Encourage them to give reasons for their opinions. After a couple of minutes, hold a brief discussion with the whole group so every pair can share their views.

2. Key words

 Ask students to work individually or in pairs and match the words with their definitions. Tell them all the words appear in the article, so they can see them in context if they are unsure about their meaning. Allow some minutes for students to check answers in pairs or groups of three before checking with the whole group.
