



Summer sun in Finland? Aland isles try to attract tourists to cooler climate

Level 2: Intermediate

Article summary: This article discusses how Finland is gaining popularity as a tourist destination.

Time: 60 minutes

Skills: Reading, Speaking, Writing

Language focus: Present continuous to

talk about trends

Materials needed: One copy of the worksheet

per student

1. Warmer

a. This activity aims to set up the topic of a perfect vacation spot. Give students some time to create their drawings and have them present their ideas in pairs or small groups. If any of your students don't want to draw, they can create a word cloud or mind map with words related to their ideal vacation spot.

2. Key words

a. Ask students to work individually or in pairs and match the words with their definitions. Tell them all the words appear in the article, so they can see them in context if they are unsure about their meaning. Allow a few minutes for students to check answers in pairs or groups of three before checking with the whole group.

3. Comprehension check

 a. Ask students to work individually and choose the correct option to complete each sentence. Once finished, give them a few minutes to check in pairs before checking answers with the whole class.

4. Key language

 Students work in pairs again, this time to complete the sentences from the article with the correct form of the verbs in brackets.

 They can do this individually or in pairs.

c. Give students some time to write their sentences and elicit examples from the whole class while checking for accuracy.

5. Discussion

 a. Students discuss the statements from the article and provide reasons for their opinions, referring to their own experiences whenever possible.

6. In your own words

a-c. Ask students to do some online research and prepare a presentation about a holiday destination that is not very popular with tourists, but they would like to visit. Each group presents their ideas and then each student decides which place they would like to visit on their next holiday.
