



'It made him an A-lister': John Ford's breakthrough film The Iron Horse at 100

Level 2: Intermediate

Article summary: The article describes the film career of the director John Ford on the centenary of his silent classic, *The Iron Horse*.

Time: 60 minutes

Skills: Reading, Speaking, Writing

Language focus: Vocabulary

1. Warmer

 a. This activity aims is to introduce the general topic of films. It focuses on six of the best-known English-language films over the last five decades. (Note that these are US release dates and dates in other countries may vary.)

2. Key words

 a. Ask students to do the exercise individually and then compare their answers in pairs or small groups. The term star-crossed lovers was first used by Shakespeare to describe Romeo and Juliet.
