This 16-part series might struggle with the novel's problematic sexual politics, but it's a big, gorgeous adaptation of a big, gorgeous book

- 1 Gabriel García Márquez's 1967 novel is a famous classic. One Hundred Years of Solitude is a big, big book. Netflix made it in the novel's home of Colombia. At 16 episodes, it's a pretty big TV series.
- 2 The book takes place mostly in one place, and it moves through several generations of the same family. The filmmakers had to create images from people's imagination. Those who love the book might not think that is possible. Others think One Hundred Years of Solitude has had too many people copy it already.
- We start in the middle of the 19th century, at the wedding of José Arcadio Buendía (Marco González) and Úrsula Iguarán (Susana Morales). They are cousins, so Úrsula's mother does not approve. She says their children will have pig's tails. Úrsula feels hurt by her mother, and José Arcadio is being followed by the ghost of a man he killed. So, they follow José Arcadio's dream of starting a new town: Macondo.

- Macondo is a place where strange things happen. Priests and babies can float; the dead choose not to stay dead. A group of gypsies visit every year, selling alchemy, magnets, ice and a syrup that makes you invisible. All of these things are treated as normal. The people in Macondo accept the magic and strange things that happen.
- The curse that says the couple's children will be beasts does not come true, at least not for a long time. However, the sons and grandsons of José Arcadio and Úrsula have a different problem. They repeat their own mistakes and those of their ancestors. This problem is shown by all the males in the family having similar names.
- 6 Politics begins to affect Macondo, bringing bad behaviour, war and opportunities for the characters to show fear or bravery. These things will be in the second part of the story. The story is split into two parts, with the next eight episodes coming next year.
- 7 A rain of yellow flowers announces the death of José Arcadio, and blood comes all the way across town to Úrsula's feet to tell her that her son is dead. These scenes are made carefully and beautifully. There's enough here to make Macondo worth revisiting.
